I HEREBY declare the following by-law made by the Council of the Mathias Colomb Band of Indians in the Province of Manitoba, at a meeting held March 30, 1961, to be in force:

By-law No.3 - A by-law to provide for the disposal of garbage and waste on the Pukatawagan Indian Reserve in the Province of Manitoba.

in subsection (a) and (r) of Section 10 of the Indian Act.

Law Number... 3

A by-law to provide for the disposal of garbage and waste on the
PIKATAVAGON Indian Reserve in the Province of Lang-
stro. (a) No person shall deposit or allow to be deposited any dead
animal, offal, fish, manure, garbage, fruit, vegetables, night soil,
filth, liquid waste or anything of a nature which is or may become
offensive or prejudicial to health upon a reserve or into or upon the
waters within or bounding upon the PIKATAVAGON Indian Reserve except
as provided hereunder.

1. Dead animals, offal, fish, manure, dry wrecks and all other like
matter may only be deposited at a common garbage disposal ground at a
place within the reserve approved by council for that purpose.
2. Night soil, liquid waste, fruit and vegetables and all other like
matter shall be disposed of in a covered cesspool with a lift opening.
3. Each person, or family, living upon the Reserve and owning, rent-
ing or borrowing a dwelling or camping upon the reserve shall have a
covered cesspool of a size not less than 4 feet x 4 feet x 6 feet or
a cesspool with an excavation of less than 90 cubic feet.
4. No cesspool will be constructed within 100 feet of any public well,
cistern, reservoir or other water supply within or bounding upon the
PIKATAVAGON Reserve.
5. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall
be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, upon summary conviction
of a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or imprisonment
for a term not exceeding twenty days or to both fine and imprisonment.

The Council of the Matthias Colomb Band of Indians at a meeting held
August 22, 1966 (date) makes the following by-law pursuant to paragraph (b)
and paragraph (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 1

A by-law to provide for the regulation of traffic in the Pukatawagan
Indian Reserve No. 198, in the Province of Manitoba.

1. In this by-law

- (a) "Band" means the Matthias Colomb Band of Indians;
 - (b) "Council" means the Council of the Band; and
 - (c) "Reserve" means the Pukatawagan Indian Reserve No. 198.
2. No vehicle shall be operated at a rate of speed in excess of 15 miles an hour within any residential area of the Reserve designated and marked as such by the Council.
 3. No vehicle shall be operated at a rate of speed in excess of 25 miles an hour within any other area of the Reserve.
 4. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Ten dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding Seven days or to both fine and imprisonment.
