DOG CONTROL BY-LAW

DO HEREBY RESOLVE:

- (1) Dog owners who keep more than five dogs for purpose of using such animals for sled dogs will:
 - A) Not require individual dog tags for identification.
 - B) Pay a flat rate of 20.00 dollars, be it he owns three or fifteen.
 - C) Be responsible to make arrangements with the Band Council for permit to hold his dogs in a confined area to alleviate nuisance problems.
 - D) Be responsible to keep such dogs chained if not kept in a confined area.
 - E) Be responsible to destroy own dogs if the need arises, be it over-crowding (beyond the persons individual control), disease, rabies, etc.
 - F) Be subject to all Federal Laws governing the keep and confinement of domestic animals.

- (2) Dog owners who keep family dogs categorized as watchdogs, pets, duck hounds, etc, will:
 - A) Be required to pay 5.00 dollars for a dog tag identification number.
 - B) Be responsible to keep their dogs from roaming freely in the community.
 - C) Be responsible for the animals disturbance, nuisances, if allowed to roam freely in the community.
 - D) Be reminded if their dogs continue to cause disturbances and nuisance.
 - E) Have their dogs destroyed if they do not adhere to these regulations.

- (3) The Band Constables under authority of the Mathias Colomb Band Council will:
 - A) Ensure the set up and procedure of a systematic recording method of issuing numbered dog tags to all dog owners.
 - B) Be responsible to enforce regulations under paragraphs 1 and 2.
 - C) Be responsible to destroy all loose dogs without dog tags after a certain period of time has lapsed after ratification of by-law.
 - D) Be responsible to arrange discard of all destroyed animals immediately.

WHEREAS: the Mathias Colomb Band has had a continuing community problem with dog control, and;

WHEREAS: loose dogs here caused health hazards by upsetting roadside garbage containers, and;

WHEREAS: loose dogs have posed very dangerous situations, especially when roaming in packs, and;

WHEREAS: loose dogs have posed very dangerous when in pursuit of a bitch in heat, and;

WHEREAS: it will have to be a community effort to decrease the number of loose dogs roaming freely, thus ensuring a measure of dog control within the community and;

WHEREAS: the Mathias Colomb Band Council will initiates the use of a systematic recording method of issuing numbered DOG TAGS to dog owners who wish to keep such animals, as per regulations of DOG CONTROL BY-LAW NUMBER.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED: that the following: DOG CONTROL BY-LAW NUMBER be enforced within the community of Pukatawagan, effective on the date it is ratified.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED: that DIAND supply to the Band Council an adequate number of tags for the purpose of dog tag number identification.

In my understanding I have a law suit pending towards Gary Dumas and his business due to the fact of negligence and not abiding to the Band Dog By law.

Furthermore for the safety of our children it is my personal recommendation to the Chief and Council of the Mathias Colomb Cree Nation that these dogs be destroyed. Community members has forwarded complaints to the R.C.M.P. regarding these same dogs, but I'm not sitting down simply of the fact that my son was close to losing his eye.

I await for your answer and these concerns are noted and fulfilled regardless.

DEAR CHIEF AND COUNCIL;

As you know, over the last few weeks there have been numerous complaints concerning dogs running loose in our reserve. We realize that Chief and Council have implemented by-laws concerning this problem, but we feel that there is a more humane and effective way to deal with this problem.

We have investigated other reserves in the area and have found that all of the reserves implement some kind of dog catching program, where they contract out to a dog catcher a certain amount on a monthly basis and it is his responsibility to patrol the reserve on a regular basis and pick up any loose or unwanted dogs and take them out and destroy them. The largest contract price that we found was \$18,000.00 a year. But we feel on our reserve a person could do this once a month for a price of \$6,000 - \$7,500.00 a year. Which is a very reasonable price and could easily be handled by the Band without putting on any financial strain on other Departments.

We must develop some system to bring us into present day standards instead of reliving this problem over and over.

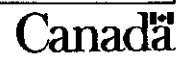

DOG BY - LAW

The Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND at a meeting held this 29 day of February 1988 hereby amends by-law number 04 to provide for the regulation and control of dogs within the boundaries of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Whereas, paragraphs (a) (e) and (r) of section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to make by-laws to provide for the health of residents on the Reserve and to prevent the spreading of diseases and the imposition of a penalty for a violation thereof, and, Whereas, it is deemed expedient to provide for the regulation and control of dogs for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Now, therefore the Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND enacts as a by-law thereof, the following:

1. In this by-law,
 - a) "Council" means the Council as defined in the Indian Act of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND:
 - b) "Reserve" means the tract of land set aside by Her Majesty within the definition of the Indian Act, for the use and benefit of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND known as the PUKATAWAGAN RESERVE.
 - c) "Constable" means a person appointed for the purpose of maintaining law and order on the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.
 - d) "Household" means a house, abode on any dwelling that is occupied.
 - e) "Pet" means a domestic dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property.
 - f) "Guard dog" means a dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property for the purpose of guarding said household and property.
2. No person shall establish a kennel on the Reserve to breed dogs without the written consent of the Band Council.
3. Any person shall, for the purpose of trapping or sport or transportation, raise any number of dogs providing he/she accepts total responsibility for the control and care of such animals and, that he/she be subject to paragraph 2.

4. No person shall allow his/her dog to run at large within the reserve.
5. No person shall possess more than one dog as guard dog, as described within said by-law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
6. No person shall possess more than ONE dog as pets, as described within said by-law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
7. Any person who owns a dog as a pet shall be required to identify such a dog with identification tags as issued by the Band Council for a fee of \$5.00.
8. A person or household that owns a dog within his/her property shall be responsible to keep that dog under control by having it muzzled or chained at all times or as a result be liable for injuries caused by having such an animal uncontrolled.
9. No person shall ill treat by beating, molesting or neglecting a dog that is tied or chained or otherwise.
- 10) The Constable shall make periodic checks on the amount and kinds of dogs possessed by each household.
- 11) The Constable may by order of the Council, destroy any stray dog that is not chained.
- 12) The Constable may by order of the Council give written notice to the owner of an undesirable dog within the reserve requiring that person to get rid of the said dog, by any means within 10 days receipt of notice.
- 13) An owner of a dog who refuses or neglects the contents of a written notice within the period of 10 days shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law.
- 14) Any person who violates any provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days or both fine and imprisonment.

 - C) Be responsible for the animals disturbance, nuisances, if allowed to roam freely in the community.
 - D) Be reminded if their dogs continue to cause disturbances and nuisance.
 - E) Have their dogs destroyed if they do not adhere to these regulations.
- 3) The Band Constables under authority of the Mathias Colomb Band Council will:
 - A) Ensure the set up and procedure of a systematic recording method of issuing numbered dog tags to all dog owners.
 - B) Be responsible to enforce regulations under paragraphs 1 and 2.
 - C) Be responsible to destroy all loose dogs without dog tags after a certain period of time has lapsed after ratification of by-law.
 - D) Be responsible to arrange discard of all destroyed animals immediately.

DOG BY - LAW

The Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND at a meeting held this 29 day of February 1988 hereby amends by-law number 01 to provide for the regulation and control of dogs within the boundaries of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Whereas, paragraphs (a) (e) and (r) of section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the council of a Band to make by-laws to provide for the health of residents on the Reserve and to prevent the spreading of diseases and the imposition of a penalty for a violation thereof, and,

Whereas, it is deemed expedient to provide for the regulation and control of dogs for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Now, therefore the Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND inacts as a by-law thereof, the following:

1. In this by-law,
 - a) "Council" means the Council as defined in the Indian Act of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND:
 - b) "Reserve" means the tract of land set aside by Her Majesty within the definition of the Indian Act, for the use and benefit of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND known as the PUKATAWAGAN RESERVE.
 - c) "Constable" means a person appointed for the purpose of maintaining law and order on the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.
 - d) "Household" means a house, abode ~~or~~ any dwelling that is occupied.
 - e) "Pet" means a domestic dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property.
 - f) "Guard dog" means a dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property for the purpose of guarding said household and property.
2. No person shall establish a kennel on the Reserve to breed dogs without the written consent of the Band Council.
3. Any person shall, for the purpose of trapping or sport or transportation, raise any number of dogs providing he/she accepts total responsibility for the control and care of such animals and, that he/.she be subject to paragraph 2.

- ✓4. No person shall allow his/her dog to run at large within the reserve.
 - ✓5. No person shall possess more than one dog as guard dog, as described within said by law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
 - ✓6. No person shall possess more than ONE dog as pets, as described within said by-law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
 - ✓7. Any person who owns a dog as a pet shall be required to indentify such a dog with identification tags as issued by the Band Council for a fee of \$ 5.00
 8. A person or household that owns a dog with a vicious nature shall be responsible to keep that dog under control by having it muzzled or chained at all times.
 9. No person shall ill treat by beating, molesting or neglecting a dog that is tied or chained or otherwise.
 - ✓10) The Constable ^{+ Dog's certificate} shall make periodic checks on the amount and kinds of dogs possessed by each household.
 - ✓11) The Constable ^{+ Dog's certificate} ~~may by order of the Council,~~ ^{will} destroy any stray dog that is not chained.
 - 12) The constable may be order of the Council give written notice to the owner of an undesirable dog within the reserve requiring that person to get rid of the said dog, by any means within 10 days receipt of notice.
 - 13) An owner of a dog who refuses or neglects the contents of a written notice within the period of 10 days shall be guilty of a breech of this by-law.
 - 14) Any person who violates any provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$ 50.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days or both fine and imprisonment.

RE: B.C.R. DOG CONTROL

Enclosed is a Band Council Resolution which is self explanatory.

Much concern has been expressed, in the past, by the general public of the community, over the rampant population of dogs that roam freely in the community. We do have an existing Dog Control By-law, that states clearly on the responsibilities of the public on the "control of dogs" that belongs to each individual. However, it has been a difficult situation to contend with.


Let me give you a brief example of what we are faced with. Up to about 1974, the use of dogs as draft animals was still the popular method of transportation on the traplines and ~~to~~ an supply and hauling of firewood in the winter. Everyone was aware of the responsibility in the care and up-keep of their own dogs and that it was essential and very important that their dogs were always contained. Then came the advent of the ski-doo and dog teams as a means of transportation and survival became next to obsolete. Since that time we have been faced with an ever increasing problem of over population of dogs, because people did not seem to care anymore about caring for and keeping "good" dogs. To compound our dilemma, small breeds of dogs were introduced into the community and we now have an abundance of all sizes from CHIHUAHUAS, to small furry collie dogs, to huge GERMAN SHEPHERD-SAINT BERNARD, mixtures.

We, as chief and council do not oppose nor discourage our people from keeping dogs as pets, but we have had on many occasions, reminded our people, at public meetings, about the importance of our dog by-law.

As stated in this submission of our by-law, we have been told that our method of destroying dogs by shooting them, must stop. That is why we are asking the Department of Indian Affairs to act upon our request before we have to explain a real emergency.

We hope you understand our situation.

DISCUSSION PAPER REGARDING DOG CONTROL

Tansi, as Community Health Workers we would like to discuss dog control with the public.

Pets, dog teams, duck hounds and guard dogs have been part of our lives for centuries because dogs were used as a form of transportation, food gatherers and protectors. However, like the buggy and horse, they have become obsolete. They have been replaced by ski-doo, outboard, gun and lock and key. Despite modern art of moving, we have too many dogs in the community. The sad part is that they merely run loose, and upset garbage stands. They scatter mess all over the community. True, most people would like to keep house pets and dog teams to maintain our way-of-life, and in most cases their care is an average to two dogs per household. On the east coast their were over 150 dogs running loose. Dog bands don't work and it violates community safety.

Under no circumstances should guns be used to humiliate dogs in public. It is against the laws of traditional culture.

Here is our proposal. The Council should establish a dog by-law. Those that would like to keep sled dogs should have designated areas for this purpose. A veterinarian should be invited to the community to distemper all dogs. A by-law should be established to pick up all loose dogs and pets and should be kept in the pound until the owner picks them up with a small fee. All dogs should be licensed and labelled

with dog-tags. If we do not solve this problem, dogs may seriously hurt children or even spread diseases to the people. Before you criticize our proposal, give us an alternative.

DOG BY - LAW

The Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND at a meeting held this 29 day of February 1988 hereby amends by-law number 04 to provide for the regulation and control of dogs within the boundaries of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Whereas, paragraphs (a) (e) and (r) of section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to make by-laws to provide for the health of residents on the Reserve and to prevent the spreading of diseases and the imposition of a penalty for a violation thereof, and Whereas, it is deemed expedient to provide for the regulation and control of dogs for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Now, therefore the Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND enacts as a by-law thereof, the following:

1. In this by-law,
 - a) "Council" means the Council as defined in the Indian Act of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND;
 - b) "Reserve" means the tract of land set aside by Her Majesty within the definition of the Indian Act, for the use and benefit of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND known as the PUKATAWAGAN RESERVE.
 - c) "Constable" means a person appointed for the purpose of maintaining law and order on the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.
 - d) "Household" means a house, abode on any dwelling that is occupied.
 - e) "Pet" means a domestic dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property.
 - f) "Guard dog" means a dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property for the purpose of guarding said household and property.
2. No person shall establish a kennel on the Reserve to breed dogs

4. No person shall allow his/her dog to run at large within the reserve.
5. No person shall possess more than one dog as guard dog, as described within said by-law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
6. No person shall possess more than ONE dog as pets, as described within said by-law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
7. Any person who owns a dog as a pet shall be required to identify such a dog with identification tags, as issued by the Band Council for a fee of \$5.00
8. A person or household that owns a dog within his/her property shall be responsible to keep that dog under control by having it muzzled or chained at all times or as a result be liable for injuries caused by having such an animal uncontrolled.
9. No person shall ill treat by beating, molesting or neglecting a dog that is tied or chained or otherwise.
- 10) The Constable shall make periodic checks on the amount and kinds of dogs possessed by each household.
- 11) The Constable may by order of the Council, destroy any stray dog that is not chained.
- 12) The Constable may by order of the Council give written notice to the owner of an undesirable dog within the reserve requiring that person to get rid of the said dog, by any means within 10 days receipt of notice.
- 13) An owner of a dog who refuses or neglects the contents of a written notice within the period of 10 days shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law.
- 14) Any person who violates any provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days or both fine and imprisonment.

RE: B.C.R. DOG CONTROL

Enclosed is a Band Council Resolution which is self explanatory.

Much concern has been expressed, in the past, by the general public of the community, over the rampant population of dogs that roam freely in the community. We do have an existing Dog Control By-Law, that states clearly on the responsibilities of the public on the "control of dogs" that belongs to each individual. However, it has been a difficult situation to contend with.


Let me give you a brief example of what we are faced with. Up to about 1974, the use of dogs as draft animals was still the popular method of transportation on the traplines and also for supply and hauling of firewood in the winter. Everyone was aware of the responsibility in the care and up-keep of their own dogs and that it was essential and very important that their dogs were always contained. Then came the advent of the ski-doo and dog teams as a means of transportation and survival became next to obsolete. Since that time we have been faced with an ever increasing problem of over population of dogs, because people did not seem to care anymore about caring for and keeping "good" dogs. To compound our dilemma, small breeds of dogs were introduced into the community and we now have an abundance of all sizes from CHIHUAHUAS, to small furry collie dogs, to huge GERMAN SHEPHERD-SAINTE BERNARD, mixtures.

We, as chief and council do not oppose nor discourage our people from keeping dogs as pets, but we have had on many occasions, reminded our people, at public meetings, about the importance of our dog by-law.

As stated in this submission of our by-law, we have been told that our method of destroying dogs by shooting them, must stop. That is why we are asking the Department of Indian Affairs to act upon our request before we have to explain a real emergency.

We hope you understand our situation.

DISCUSSION PAPER REGARDING DOG CONTROL

Tansi, as Community Health Workers we would like to discuss dog control with the public.

Pets, dog teams, duck hounds and guard dogs have been part of our lives for centuries because dogs were used as a form of transportation, food gatherers and protectors. However, like the buggy and horse, they have become obsolete. They have been replaced by ski-doo, outboard, gun and lock and key. Despite modern art of moving, we have too many dogs in the community. The sad part is that they merely run loose, and upset garbage stands. They scatter mess all over the community. True, most people would like to keep house pets and dog teams to maintain our way-of-life, and in most cases their rate of average to two dogs per household. On the last count there were over 150 dogs running loose. Dog control don't work and it violates community safety.

Under no circumstances should guns be used to humiliate dogs in public. It is against the laws of traditional culture.

Here is our proposal. The Council should establish a dog by-law. Those that would like to keep sled dogs should have designated areas for this purpose. A veterinarian should be invited to the community to distemper all dogs. A by-law should be established to pick up all loose dogs and pets and should be kept in the pound until the owner picks them up with a small fee. All dogs should be licensed and labelled

with dog-tags. If we do not solve this problem, dogs may seriously hurt children or even spread diseases to the people. Before you criticize our proposal, give us an alternative.

This proposal will be discussed in our upcoming Band meeting for Council to enact a dog-control system. We need your direction to make our community a safe place to raise our children.

If you want to discuss this matter with us, please come and see us at the nursing station.

By-Law No. — Unnumbered - Being a By-Law Respecting "Dog Control"

This refers to your DEX dated September 5, 1984 to which you attached a daxed true copy of the subject by-law.

Registration of the by-law by Privy Council Office as required by the Statutory Instruments Act was made on Sept 20 1984, Registration No. SOR/84-769. The forty-day period stipulated in sub-section 82(2) of the Indian Act expired on September 8 1984. Accordingly the effective date of the by-law is September 20, 1984.

The coming into force of any by-law pursuant to section 82(2) of the Indian Act cannot, of course, be taken as any expression of opinion by the Minister that the by-law is valid. Only a Court of Law can make a final decision on the validity of a by-law if and when it is ever challenged in a Court.

Please note that the by-law was registered only because of the timing. From the information available to us it would appear that the 40 days during which the by-law could have been disallowed would have expired on September 8, 1984. The copy of the by-law was not received here until September 7, and therefore no time remained for that action. We would appreciate it if you would request all staff members involved in handling by-laws that "time is of the essence" and therefore a copy should be forwarded immediately to Headquarters followed by any comments, ribbon-copy etc.

The intent of the by-law is fairly clear but the wording leaves much to be desired. As an example there is no penalty clause, and a number of sections would indicate that someone is responsible for doing something but no time limits criteria are set out. In addition terms are used but not defined.





- (1) Dog owners who keep more than five dogs for the purpose of using such animals for sled dogs will:
 - A) Not require individual dog tags for identification
 - B) Pay a flat rate of 20.00 dollars, be it he owns three or fifteen.
 - C) Be responsible to make arrangements with the Band Council for permit to hold his dogs in a confined area to alleviate nuisance problems.
 - D) Be responsible to keep such dogs chained if not kept in a confined area.
 - E) Be responsible to destroy own dogs if the need arises, be it over-crowding (beyond the persons individual control), disease, rabies, etc.
 - F) Be subject to all Federal Laws governing the keep and confinement of domestic animals.
- (2) Dog owners who keep family dogs categorized as watchdogs, pets, duck hounds, etc, will:
 - A) Be required to pay 5.00 dollars for a dog tag identification number.
 - B) Be responsible to keep their dogs from roaming freely in the community.
 - C) Be responsible for the animals disturbance, nuisances, if allowed to roam freely in the community.
 - D) Be reminded if their dogs continue to cause disturbances and nuisance
 - E) Have their dogs destroyed if they do not adhere to these regulations.
- (3) The Band Constables under authority of the Mathias Colomb Band Council will:
 - A) Ensure the set up and procedure of a systematic recording method of issuing numbered dog tags to all dog owners.
 - B) Be responsible to enforce regulations under paragraphs 1 and 2.
 - C) Be responsible to destroy all loose dogs without dog tags after a certain period of time has lapsed after ratification of by-law.
 - D) Be responsible to arrange discard of all destroyed animals immediately.

DOG BY - LAW

The Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND at a meeting held this 29 day of February 1988 hereby amends by-law number 04 to provide for the regulation and control of dogs within the boundaries of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Whereas, paragraphs (a) (e) and (r) of section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to make by-laws to provide for the health of residents on the Reserve and to prevent the spreading of diseases and the imposition of a penalty for a violation thereof, and, Whereas, it is deemed expedient to provide for the regulation and control of dogs for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Now, therefore the Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND enacts as a by-law thereof, the following:

1. In this by-law,
 - a) "Council" means the Council as defined in the Indian Act of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND:
 - b) "Reserve" means the tract of land set aside by Her Majesty within the definition of the Indian Act, for the use and benefit of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND known as the PUKATAWAGAN RESERVE.
 - c) "Constable" means a person appointed for the purpose of maintaining law and order on the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.
 - d) "Household" means a house, abode on any dwelling that is occupied.
 - e) "Pet" means a domestic dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property.
 - f) "Guard dog" means a dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property for the purpose of guarding said household and property.
2. No person shall establish a kennel on the Reserve to breed dogs without the written consent of the Band Council.
3. Any person shall, for the purpose of trapping or sport or transportation, raise any number of dogs providing he/she accepts total responsibility for the control and care of such animals and, that he/she be subject to paragraph 2.

4. No person shall allow his/her dog to run at large within the reserve.
5. No person shall possess more than one dog as guard dog, as described within said by law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
6. No person shall possess more than ONE dog as pets, as described within said by-law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
7. Any person who owns a dog as a pet shall be required to identify such a dog with identification tags as issued by the Band Council for a fee of \$5.00
8. A person or household that owns a dog within his/her property shall be responsible to keep that dog under control by having it muzzled or chained at all times or as a result be liable for injuries caused by having such an animal uncontrolled.
9. No person shall ill treat by beating, molesting or neglecting a dog that is tied or chained or otherwise.
- 10) The Constable shall make periodic checks on the amount and kinds of dogs possessed by each household.
- 11) ✓ The Constable may by order of the Council, destroy any stray dog that is not chained.
- 12) The Constable may by order of the Council give written notice to the owner of an undesirable dog within the reserve requiring that person to get rid of the said dog, by any means within 10 days receipt of notice.
- 13) An owner of a dog who refuses or neglects the contents of a written notice within the period of 10 days shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law.
- 14) Any person who violates any provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days or both fine and imprisonment.

We wish to acknowledge receipt of your Band Council Resolution dated November 19, 1993.

Although this document is in the form of a BCR, its intention appears to be the amendment of the Mathias Colomb Dog By-law No. 04, passed on February 29, 1988. As pointed out below, in order to amend a by-law, it is necessary to pass another by-law; a by-law cannot be amended by a BCR. However, we are treating your document as a by-law.

Pursuant to section 82(2) of the Indian Act, this amending by-law came into force on December 29, 1993.

Please note that the coming into force of any by-law is not an expression of opinion by the Minister that the by-law is valid. The Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development is not ruling on the validity of a by-law; only a court of law has such power.

Although your amending by-law is in force, we do have comments to make.

In future, in order to avoid confusion (since a BCR, unlike a by-law, is not a law), if you wish to amend, or, for that matter repeal, any existing Mathias Colomb by-law, this should be done by means of a by-law, and not by BCR. This is the case because a by-law, unlike a BCR, is a law and only a law can be used to amend another law.

As well, particularly in light of the comments below regarding recitals, you may wish to consider repealing your amending by-law and replacing it with a new by-law drafted in accordance with the guidelines set out in the enclosed document entitled Amending/Repealing a By-law and the Sample Amending By-law which is attached thereto.

If you review the enclosed Sample Amending By-law, you will note that, just like any other by-law, it contains several elements or parts (as a matter of interest, your 1988 Dog By-law contains all of these elements). The elements are:

1. Number and Title;
2. Recitals (the "WHEREAS" clauses);
3. The enacting clause ("NOW THEREFORE the council of the _____ Band enacts as a by-law thereof as follows:");
4. The body or operative section (section 1);
5. Date the by-law was passed and signatures; and
6. Date that a true copy was mailed to the Minister.

Your amending by-law does not contain all of these elements.

In particular, we wish to draw your attention to the question of recitals (the "WHEREAS" clauses). The reason for including recitals in a by-law is to inform the reader generally of the by-law's purpose and other facts relevant to the subject matter to be legislated upon. As you can see from the Sample Amending By-law, recitals outline the basic reasons for enacting the by-law and should include the statutory authority on which the by-law is based using the language of the *Indian Act*.

You will note that, in the Sample Amending By-law (and in your 1988 Dog By-law) the recitals (the "WHEREAS" clauses) and the body or operative sections are distinct and separate parts of the by-law. This is not the case, however, with your amending by-law. Your amending by-law is made up entirely of recitals. As well, the substantive provisions are included in the recitals, specifically the third and fifth recitals. This could lead to confusion.

If you do decide to repeal and re-enact your amending by-law, you may at the same time want to consider repealing the Mathias Colomb Dog Control By-law passed on July 30, 1984 (a copy of which is attached), as it would appear to overlap with your 1988 Dog By-law.

We trust that the foregoing comments are of assistance. If you have any questions, or require further information regarding the amendment of by-laws, please contact the Manitoba Regional office or you may contact Roy Gray, the By-law Advisor at headquarters who is responsible for this file, at (819) 953-5272.

Please note that our above comments should not be treated as a legal opinion. They are intended as suggestions only, and we cannot guarantee that a by-law based upon them would be upheld in a court. Furthermore, submission of any by-law in accordance with our comments does not automatically ensure that the by-law will be allowed to come into force. Any by-law which is submitted must be considered in its entirety before such a determination can be made.

AMENDING/REPEALING A BY-LAW

AMENDING

There may be parts or all of a by-law that become dated. Perhaps the band council has taken somebody to court under a by-law, and having found a loophole in it or otherwise deficient, the judge dismissed the charge. If the by-law doesn't work in court, then the band council should certainly revise the by-law and cover the loophole or correct the legal deficiency.

When amending a section of a by-law, different approaches can be considered. Where only a few words of the section are to be changed, it is acceptable to strike out the words in the original section and replace them with different words. A suggested format is the following:

1. *Section 7 of By-law No. _____ is amended by striking out the words "twenty-five dollars" where they appear therein and substituting therefor the words "fifty dollars".*

However, where there are several changes that must be made to the section, it may be cumbersome to use that format. Accordingly an alternative format is recommended, which involves repealing the entire section or subsection and substituting a new section or subsection. For example:

Section 7 of By-law No. _____ is repealed and the following substituted therefor:

7. *The fee payable for a license under this by-law is:*

- (a) *two dollars per day, or any part thereof,*
- (b) *five dollars per week, or*
- (c) *fifty dollars per year.*

It is also possible to combine both approaches along the following lines:

Section 7 of By-law No. _____ is amended by striking out the words "twenty five dollars" where they appear therein and substituting therefor the words "fifty dollars", so that section 7 now reads:

7. *The fee payable for a license under this by-law is:*
(a) two dollars per day, or any part thereof,
(b) five dollars per week, or
(c) fifty dollars per year.

There is, however, a greater risk of error in that approach. It is imperative that the wording of the new section, as fully set out, accurately incorporate the changes to the specific words. If an inconsistency should arise (e.g. someone neglected to incorporate the change into paragraph (c)), the amendment would be invalid.

SUMMARY

Amending an already existing band council by-law follows exactly the same drafting, passing, and enacting procedure as a regular new by-law. A motion to pass an amendment to a band by-law still has to be recorded in the band council minutes, just as the motion to pass the original by-law was recorded.

The enactments in a by-law simply state the old words that are going to be taken out of the existing by-law and the new words that are going to be put in their place. Then, to make certain that there is no misunderstanding, the new "amended" paragraph is printed out in its entirety as a part of the new by-law.

And, as is usual in a by-law, the date of passing and the official signatures are added at the end.

Of course, as with all band by-laws, this by-law amendment has to be mailed to the Department to be registered as an official band by-law to amend a previous by-law. So, it is still necessary to mail the new by-law to the Department of Indian Affairs within four days of passing it and to have this submission certified by a department official.

Also, amendments to by-laws should be copied in original form and supplied to your local police, magistrate or judge, and Crown Prosecutor, just as the original by-laws were.

IN OTHER WORDS, AMENDING BY-LAWS SHOULD BE TREATED EXACTLY THE SAME AS THE ORIGINAL BY-LAWS. THE ONLY DIFFERENCE IS THAT THE ENACTMENTS SECTION OF THE AMENDING BY-LAW WILL CONTAIN REFERENCES ONLY TO THOSE SECTIONS OF THE ORIGINAL BY-LAW WHICH ARE TO BE CHANGED.

REPEALING

Rather than having by-laws that are of no use to the community, or that are unenforceable, band council should consider the repeal (the annulling of a previously existing law by the enactment of a subsequent law which declares that the former law shall be revoked and abrogated) of these.

A band council should faithfully review all of the existing by-laws for its community and ensure itself that the by-laws still meet the objectives for which they were passed initially.

REPEALING A BY-LAW SIMPLY REQUIRES THE PASSING OF ANOTHER BY-LAW. THE BAND COUNCIL MUST FOLLOW THE EXACT SAME STEPS AS IT WOULD FOR A NEW BY-LAW. THE ONLY DIFFERENCE IS THAT THIS BY-LAW CONTAINS A CLAUSE WHICH STATES THAT THE PREVIOUS BY-LAW IS REPEALED. IN THE REPEALING BY-LAW YOU MUST STATE THE TITLE, NUMBER AND THE ENACTMENT DATE OF THE BY-LAW TO BE REPEALED.

In accordance with the procedural requirements set out in the Indian Act and in order to have the repealing by-law registered, it must be sent by mail to the department within (4) four days of its enactment.

DISCUSSION PAPER REGARDING DOG CONTROL

Tansi, as Community Health Workers we would like to discuss dog control with the public.

Pets, dog teams, duck hounds and guard dogs have been part of our lives for centuries because dogs were used as a form of transportation, food gatherers and protectors. However, like the buggy and horse, they have become obsolete. They have been replaced by ski-doo, outboard gun and lock and key. Despite modern art of moving, we have too many dogs in the community. The sad part is that they merely run loose, and upset garbage stands. They scatter mess all over the community. True, most people would like to keep house pets and dog-teams to maintain our way-of-life, and in most cases their are an average to two dogs per household. On the last count their were over 150 dogs running loose. Dog-shooters don't work and it violates community safety.

Under no circumstances should guns be used to humiliate dogs in public. It is against the laws of traditional culture.

Here is our proposal. The Council should establish a dog by-law. Those that would like to keep sled dogs should have designated areas for this purpose. A veterinarian should be invited to the community to distemper all dogs. A by-law should be established to pick up all loose dogs and pets and should be kept in the pound until the owner picks them up with a small fee. All dogs should be licensed and labelled

with dog-tags. If we do not solve this problem, dogs may seriously hurt children or even spread diseases to the people. Before you criticize our proposal, give us an alternative.

This proposal will be discussed in our upcoming Band meeting for Council to enact a dog-control system. We need your direction to make our community a safe place to raise our children.

If you want to discuss this matter with us, please come and see us at the nursing station.

DOG BY - LAW

The Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND at a meeting held this 29 day of February 1988 hereby amends by-law number 01 to provide for the regulation and control of dogs within the boundaries of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

By-Law No. -- Unnumbered -- Being a By-Law Respecting "Dog Control"

This refers to your DEX dated September 5, 1984 to which you attached a daxed true copy of the subject by-law.

Registration of the by-law by Privy Council Office as required by the Statutory Instruments Act was made on Sept 20 1984, Registration No. SOR/84-769. The forty-day period stipulated in sub-section 82(2) of the Indian Act expired on September 8 1984. Accordingly the effective date of the by-law is September 20, 1984.

The coming into force of any by-law pursuant to section 82(2) of the Indian Act cannot, of course, be taken as any expression of opinion by the Minister that the by-law is valid. Only a Court of Law can make a final decision on the validity of a by-law if and when it is ever challenged in a Court.

Please note that the by-law was registered only because of the timing. From the information available to us it would appear that the 40 days during which the by-law could have been disallowed would have expired on September 8, 1984. The copy of the by-law was not received here until September 7, and therefore no time remained for that action. We would appreciate it if you would request all staff members involved in handling by-laws that "time is of the essence" and therefore a copy should be forwarded immediately to Headquarters followed by any comments, ribbon-copy etc.

The intent of the by-law is fairly clear but the wording leaves much to be desired. As an example there is no penalty clause, and a number of sections would indicate that someone is responsible for doing something but no time limits criteria are set out. In addition terms are used but not defined.





We have just received your memoranda addressed to the Regional Office including a number of resolutions of the above noted Band Council respecting the

- (i) imposition of a curfew (September 17, 1974 - your file 578/18-1);
- (ii) collection of sling shots and bows and arrows (September 17, 1974 - your file 578/18-1);
- (iii) control of firearms (August 27, 1974 - your file 578/3-10-46); and
- (iv) enforcement of the liquor sections of the Indian Act and fines therefrom (August 27, 1974 - your file 578/18-1);

on which we have the following comments

1. Resolution of September 17, 1974, re curfew
Band Councils have for a number of years enacted by-laws in respect to this subject. For your information I attach a sample of two different versions of this type of by-law.
2. Resolution of September 17, 1974, re sling shots etc.
It may be that the use of such items as sling shots, and bows and arrows could come under the Criminal Code of Canada as an offensive weapon or common nuisance. I doubt that owning or having such items is by itself illegal and would therefore question the Council's right

to collect them all. On the other hand if there is a specific problem related to these items which Council wishes to control it may be possible to do so by by-law under section 81(c) and (d) of the Indian Act depending on what that problem may be. Before drafting by-laws of this type however I would suggest that the Council discuss its needs with the appropriate law enforcement officer to ensure that it is drafted in such a way as to be enforceable. In addition if more details were given as to the kind of problem involved it may be that a sample by-law could be drafted here.

- C. Resolution of August 22, 1974, re firearms
Again the use of firearms is controlled basically by the Criminal Code of Canada. However, a by-law prohibiting their use within a defined area may be effective, and I would suggest pursuant to sections 81(c) and (d) of the Indian Act. It may also be that there is a Provincial law related to the discharge of firearms within a built up area, which should be checked with the provincial authorities. The discharge may also be covered by the "common nuisance" sections of the Criminal Code. I attach a sample by-law by which control of air guns is attempted within a defined area and perhaps this could be adapted to suit the required needs. In any event I would suggest that Council discuss its need with the appropriate law enforcement agency who could undoubtedly be of assistance to them.

- D. Resolution of August 22, 1974, re fines and liquor sections of the Indian Act
Until such time as a referendum is held in favor of the possession or sale of liquor on a Reserve under the Provincial laws, the liquor sections of the Indian Act apply and a resolution of this type is not necessary. However fines imposed under the Act are controlled by section 104; and specifically by an order in council enacted in 1937 fines related to the liquor sections form part of a special fund to be used for "... the suppression of the liquor trade ...". Such fines could not therefore be redirected by a resolution of this type. It may be possible upon a resolution of the Band Council, to obtain an amendment to that order-in-council which would have the desired effect. If the Council wishes to try this approach please have them pass a resolution so requesting and indicating the use to which the funds would be put. We would then attempt to secure an appropriate order-in-council.

- E. General

- (1) As a policy or directive of Council most of the resolutions which you forwarded may be effective by virtue of the Council's position within the Band and therefore a more formal method, such as a by-law, may not be appropriate. However, I doubt that the resolutions as drafted would be effective in law if a band member wished to object and took the matter to court. If the resolutions as drafted are effective then

I would question that the Council should proceed further; but I believe they should be made aware of the possibility of their failure if the Council attempted to enforce them, and if a Band Member objected; particularly if they objected to the point of going to court.

- (ii) Many of the suggested penalty clauses would not be effective as part of a by-law as such penalties must conform to section 81(r) of the Indian Act.
- (iii) It should also be remembered that whether or not a by-law in any of these fields would be legal will depend on the drafting of the by-law, and the Court's interpretation - in the long run only a court can make such a decision.

I trust the foregoing is of some assistance.

FIREARMS BY-LAW
#140190

The Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND at a joint Band Public/Council meeting held this 18th day of November 1991, hereby proclaims By-Law number 18/11/91 providing for the regulation and control of firearms within the boundaries of PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Whereas; paragraphs (c) and (d) of section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the council of a Band to make by-laws to provide for public safety of the residents on the Reserve and to maintain the observance of law and order and the prevention of disorderly conduct and the imposition of a penalty for violation thereof,

And whereas; it is deemed expedient to provide for the regulation and control of firearms for the safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Now, therefore; the Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND inacts as a by-law thereof, the following:

1. In this by-law,

- a) **"Council", means;** the Council as defined in the Indian Act of the Mathias Colomb Indian Band.
- b) **"Reserve", means;** the tract of land set aside by Her Majesty within the definition of the Indian Act, for the use benefit of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND known as the PUKATAWAGAN RESERVE.
- c) **"Firearm" means;** any device that fires projectiles by means of explosives, compressed air or springs foregoing includes a rifle, shotgun, pistol, revolver, spring gun and crossbow but does not include bow or a toy.
- d) **"Hunting" means;** chasing, driving, flushing, attracting, pursuing, worrying, following after or on the trail of searching for, trapping, attempting to trap, shooting at, stalking or lying in wait for any wildlife, whether or not the wildlife is then or subsequently captures, killed, taken or wounded, but does not include stalking, attracting, searching for, or lying in wait any wildlife by an unarmed person solely for the purpose of watching the wildlife or of taking pictures of the wildlife.
- e) **"Trapping" means;** taking, capturing or killing or attempting to take, capture or kill wildlife by any means or contrivance designed to enclose, capture, hold, ensnare or otherwise restrain an animal, whether that means or contrivance kills the animal or not.
- f) **"F.A.C." means;** Firearms Acquisition Certificate.

2. No person shall have in their possession any FIREARM without an F.A.C. as set out in the within by-law.
3. All persons that have in their possession any FIREARM(S) shall immediately provide all firearms to the Band Council for storages.
 - a) Any person not wishing to store FIREARMS in their possession with the Band Council, may make alternate arrangements provided that the storages of the Band FIREARMS is outside the boundaries of the RESERVE and is removed from the boundary of the RESERVE on or before January 14, 1990.
 - b) To keep guns at home, the firearms owner must purchase gun locks and must give one key to the Band Constable for safe keeping.
4. Any person who wishes to use FIREARMS for the purpose of TRAPPING will be permitted to take their FIREARMS and leave their FIREARMS on the Trapline, provided that the trapline is outside the boundary of the RESERVE. On returning to the RESERVE with FIREARMS, FIREARMS will be stored pursuant to Section 3.
5. Any person who wishes to use FIREARMS for the purpose of HUNTING, will be permitted to obtain their FIREARMS stored with the Band Council, provided that the FIREARMS are returned for storage immediately after HUNTING has been completed.
6. Any person who violates any provision of this by-law shall at the discretion of the Council to a Provincial Judge be fined an amount not exceeding \$100.00 or three months in jail or both.
7. Any person who contravenes the By-Law and is assessed a penalty pursuant to the provisions of the By-Law has a right of appeal to Chief and Council, at a special meeting to be convened by Chief and Council within two weeks.

DOG BY - LAW

The Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND at a meeting held this 29 day of February 1988 hereby amends by-law number 04 to provide for the regulation and control of dogs within the boundaries of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Whereas, paragraphs (a) (e) and (r) of section 81 of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to make by-laws to provide for the health of residents on the Reserve and to prevent the spreading of diseases and the imposition of a penalty for a violation thereof, and, whereas, it is deemed expedient to provide for the regulation and control of dogs for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.

Now, therefore the Council of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND enacts as a by-law thereof, the following:

1. In this by-law,
 - a) "Council" means the Council as defined in the Indian Act of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND;
 - b) "Reserve" means the tract of land set aside by Her Majesty within the definition of the Indian Act, for the use and benefit of the MATHIAS COLOMB INDIAN BAND known as the PUKATAWAGAN RESERVE.
 - c) "Constable" means a person appointed for the purpose of maintaining law and order on the PUKATAWAGAN INDIAN RESERVE.
 - d) "Household" means a house, abode on any dwelling that is occupied.
 - e) "Pet" means a domestic dog kept by a person within the confines of his/her household and property.
 - f) "Guard dog" means a dog kept by a person within the confine: of his/her household and property for the purpose of guarding said household and property.
2. No person shall establish a kennel on the Reserve to breed dogs without the written consent of the Band Council.
3. Any person shall, for the purpose of trapping or sport or transportation, raise any number of dogs providing he/she accepts total responsibility for the control and care of such animals and, that he/she be subject to paragraph 2.

4. No person shall allow his/her dog to run at large within the reserve.
5. No person shall possess more than one dog as guard dog, as described within said by law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
6. No person shall possess more than ONE dog as pets, as described within said by-law, and shall be bound and subject to all conditions of the by-law.
7. Any person who owns a dog as a pet shall be required to identify such a dog with identification tags, as issued by the Band Council for a fee of \$5.00
8. A person or household that owns a dog within his/her property shall be responsible to keep that dog under control by having it muzzled or chained at all times or as a result be liable for injuries caused by having such an animal uncontrolled.
9. No person shall ill treat by beating, molesting or neglecting a dog that is tied or chained or otherwise.
- 10) The Constable shall make periodic checks on the amount and kinds of dogs possessed by each household.
- 11) The Constable may by order of the Council, destroy any stray dog that is not chained.
- 12) The Constable may by order of the Council give written notice to the owner of an undesirable dog within the reserve requiring that person to get rid of the said dog, by any means within 10 days receipt of notice.
- 13) An owner of a dog who refuses or neglects the contents of a written notice within the period of 10 days shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law.
- 14) Any person who violates any provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days or both fine and imprisonment.

Curfew By-law

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of October 25th together with enclosure and I would advise as follows:

1. Bands in this Agency who have enacted a Curfew By-law, namely The Pas and the Mathias Colomb Bands, will be queried through the Band Council, on the points raised. Although Bands who have not enacted such a by-law could be asked for an opinion, I see little value in such an exercise as there is really nothing for them on which to base an opinion.
2. I personally see little point in the penalty clause providing for a jail sentence as well as a fine. Responsible parents are not a problem and irresponsible parents would, if convicted under the by-law, sooner take the jail sentence than pay the fine as it would
 - (a) allow them to be "guests of the Queen".
 - (b) give them another lever to ask for welfare assistance.

However, if only a fine is to be imposed and the fine is not paid, what is the alternative?

3. A curfew by-law is not, as I see it, a useful instrument. It is merely a method for parents and Band Councils to shirk their responsibility by palming this responsibility into the hands of the Supernumerary Constable or R.C.M.P.

3. Is the existence of the by-law seeming to cause parents to fail their responsibility for the control and discipline of their children.

You may of course consider that there are other questions to be raised.

Curfew By-law

It is noted that a number of bands have made curfew by-laws under section 80 of the Indian Act which contain a penalty clause providing for a jail sentence as well as a fine. The social implications of a jail sentence in this context has been seriously questioned by the Social Programs Division and consequently it is felt that band councils should be asked to give second thought to the inclusion of a jail sentence in future by-laws of this kind. Sample curfew by-laws on hand at Branch Headquarters will be re-drafted excluding provision for a jail sentence.

Another point that has been raised in connection with the curfew by-law concerns enforcement. It has been pointed out that it is not realistic to make by-laws of this kind if the R.C.M. Police or supernumary constables are not in a position to enforce them. As indicated in section 6.26(d) of the Field Manual, band councils concerned should consult with the police before enacting curfew by-laws.

A further point raised by the Social Programs Division is the necessity for parental involvement in evaluating the need for a curfew by-law and parental awareness of responsibility in enforcing a curfew by (1) attempting to discipline their own children and (2) by co-operating to the fullest extent with persons authorized to enforce the curfew.

It will be appreciated if you would have these points brought to the attention of band councils in your Region.

By-Law No. -- Unnumbered - Being a By-Law Respecting "Dog Control!"

This refers to your DEX dated September 5, 1984 to which you attached a daxed true copy of the subject by-law.

Registration of the by-law by Privy Council Office as required by the Statutory Instruments Act was made on Sept 20 1984. Registration No. SOR/84-769. The forty-day period stipulated in sub-section 82(2) of the Indian Act expired on September 8 1984. Accordingly the effective date of the by-law is September 20, 1984.

The coming into force of any by-law pursuant to section 82(2) of the Indian Act cannot, of course, be taken as any expression of opinion by the Minister that the by-law is valid. Only a Court of Law can make a final decision on the validity of a by-law if and when it is ever challenged in a Court.

Please note that the by-law was registered only because of the timing. From the information available to us it would appear that the 40 days during which the by-law could have been disallowed would have expired on September 8, 1984. The copy of the by-law was not received here until September 7, and therefore no time remained for that action. We would appreciate it if you would request all staff members involved in handling by-laws that "time is of the essence" and therefore a copy should be forwarded immediately to Headquarters followed by any comments, ribbon-copy etc.

The intent of the by-law is fairly clear but the wording leaves much to be desired. As an example there is no penalty clause, and a number of sections would indicate that someone is responsible for doing something but no time limits criteria are set out. In addition terms are used but not defined.





- (2) Dog owners who keep family dogs categorized as watchdogs, pets, duck hounds, etc, will:
 - A) Be required to pay 5.00 dollars for a dog tag identification number.
 - B) Be responsible to keep their dogs from roaming freely in the community.
 - C) Be responsible for the animals disturbance, nuisances, if allowed to roam freely in the community.
 - D) Be reminded if their dogs continue to cause disturbances and nuisance
 - E) Have their dogs destroyed if they do not adhere to these regulations.
- (3) The Band Constables under authority of the Mathias Colomb Band Council will:
 - A) Ensure the set up and procedure of a systematic recording method of issuing numbered dog tags to all dog owners.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED: that DIAND supply to the Band Council an adequate number of tags for the purpose of dog number identification.

 - D) Be responsible to arrange discard of all destroyed animals immediately.
